

Responses to Questions for IFB # 1114
 Digital Voice and Location Radio Systems for three (3) DJJOY Facilities:
 Goshen Secure Center, Highland Residential Center,
 and Brentwood Residential Center

Q1	How many of each type (Display and Non-Display) Subscriber Unit are required for each location?
A1	This is an estimate, with a + or – factor of five (5): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Highland – estimated: Total 110 (15 Display and 95 Non-Display units) • Goshen – estimated: Total 110 (30 Display and 80 Non-Display units) • Brentwood – estimated: Total 65 (7 Display and 58 Non-Display units)
Q2	It was observed that 2 Repeaters should be installed at Highland and Goshen in order to support 2 Talk Groups and 1 Data Location timeslot. Should we be bidding 2 Repeaters at these locations or will 1 shared Timeslot be sufficient?
A2	Highland will need two (2) repeaters to cover the campus appropriately, for Goshen one (1) repeater should be sufficient, and Brentwood will need one (1) repeater as it currently does not have one.
Q3	Will the Bid require Repeater Spares for each Repeater?
A3	No, this bid does not require spare repeaters.
Q4	We still need to see copies of your Licenses for each location.
A4	The licenses are not required to submit a bid proposal in response to this IFB. OCFS will provide copies of the necessary FCC licenses to the winning bidder.
Q5	Will there be any issues with scheduling work (beacon installation) within the Client Occupied Spaces or the Dispatch locations?
A5	There will be coordination with the facility to schedule specific agreed-upon dates and timeframes.
Q6	The IFB states that equivalent Projects have been Bid, accepted and installed at other NYS OCFS locations. I was only able to find a Letter of Interest for a system at Taberg NY with no equipment counts. In our meetings you indicated that there were more than 1. Can you let me know where to find the counts of how much equipment was purchased and installed with the final awarded price?
A6	Previous projects were completed through a variety of smaller and less formal procurement methods. In the interests of completing this work in a more timely and efficient manner, OCFS has released this formal Invitation for Bids for additional services and equipment. For the purposes of this solicitation, OCFS expects bid responders to create their own bid proposal using information provided by the IFB document, this Questions and Answers document, and their site visits.
