## I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Administrative Directive is to advise local social services districts of the revised closed-ended Title XX Federal funds for the Federal Fiscal Year 1983-84 (see attached Appendix A). Public Law 98-135 increased New York State's Title XX authorization level by \$1,908,355. Of this amount \$1,870,188 is being passed through to the local districts. Consequently, this document will supercede 84 ADM-24. As in the past appropriate state matching funds will be available.

#### BACKGROUND 11.

New York State's share of the Federal Title XX basic social services funds allotment for FFY 1983-84 is \$206,102,419. Two percent or \$4,122,048 was withheld for Services Training purposes which leaves \$201,980,371 available for district allocations. This amount represents a 9.13 percent increase over last year's allocation. Of this amount, \$195,077,075 will be distributed to each district in the same manner and amounts as were allocated in FFY 82/83.

The additional funds of \$6,903,296 are being distributed to each district in the same proportion as the total allocation of funds for FFY 82/83. Thus for example, in FFY 83/84, Albany County's added allocation is determined as follows:

Albany County Allocation-82/83=2,383,538=1.2218% x 6,903,296=\$84,348 Allocation 82/83 195,077,075

NOTE: Local district services training expenditures will be reimbursed from each districts allocation for FFY 1983/84.

# III. PROGRAM IMPLICATIONS

The amounts stated in Appendix A represent Federal ceilings on reimbursement for services expenditures for program year 1983/84. These allocations have been presented to the Block Grant Advisory Committee for their review and comment.

As was done in prior years, any unused service funds will be reallocated among those districts having expenditures in excess of this close-ended allocation at the end of Federal Fiscal Year 1983/84.

# IV. EFFECTIVE DATE

As previously indicated, these reimbursement ceilings were effective October 1, 1983.
