This report, prepared pursuant to section 20(5) of the Social Services Law (SSL), concerns: A report made to the New York Statewide Central Register of Child Abuse and Maltreatment (SCR) involving the death of a child.
The death of a child for whom child protective services has an open case.
The death of a child whose care and custody or custody and guardianship has been transferred to an authorized agency.
The death of a child for whom the local department of social services has an open preventive service case.

The Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) is mandated by section 20 of the SSL to investigate or cause for the investigation of the cause and circumstances surrounding the death, review such investigation, and prepare and issue a fatality report in regard to the categories of deaths noted above involving a child, except where a local or regional fatality review team issues a report, as authorized by law.

Such report must include: the cause of death; the identification of child protective or other services provided or actions taken regard to such child and child's family; any extraordinary or pertinent information concerning the circumstances of the child's death; whether the child or the child's family received assistance, care or services from the social services district prior to the child's death; any action or further investigation undertaken by OCFS or the social services district since the child's death; and as appropriate, recommendations for local or state administrative or policy changes.

This report contains no information that would identify the deceased child, his or her siblings, the parent, parents, or other persons legally responsible for the child, and any members of the deceased child's household.

By statute, this report will be forwarded to the social services district, chief county executive officer, chairperson of the local legislative body of the county where the child died and the social services district that had legal custody of the child, if different. Notice of the issuance of this report will be sent to the Speaker of the Assembly and the Temporary President of the Senate of the State of New York.

This report may <u>only</u> be disclosed to the public by OCFS pursuant to section 20(5) of the SSL. It may be released by OCFS only after OCFS has determined that such disclosure is not contrary to the best interests of the deceased child's siblings or other children in the household.

OCFS' review included an examination of actions taken by individual caseworkers and supervisors within the social services district and agencies under contract with the social services district. The observations and recommendations contained in this report reflect OCFS' assessment and the performance of these agencies.

Presenting Information

An SCR report received alleged that on an unknown date in 2008, the mother gave conflicting information regarding the 2-month-old subject child's death. The mother initially reported that the subject child was left in a swing in front of an air conditioner. Subsequently, the child had difficulty breathing which led to the child's death. The mother also reported that she went to sleep with the child on the couch and woke up later to find the child in the couch cushions deceased. Due to conflicting information given about how the child died the death was deemed suspicious.

Executive Summary

On 6/6/20, the Montgomery County Department of Social Services (MCDSS) received an SCR report regarding the death of the 2-month-old subject child that occurred on 3/26/10. At the time of her death, the child resided with her mother, grandfather and 3-year-old sibling. The household composition at the time of the SCR report was the mother, grandfather, 13-year-old sibling, 6-year-old sibling and 4-year-old twin siblings.

MCDSS conducted a joint investigation with law enforcement and were informed that law enforcement had previously investigated the death in 2010 and closed their case. MCDSS requested records from first responders and collaterals regarding the fatality. Through casework and collateral contacts it was learned on the morning of 3/26/10, the child was crying and the mother bottle fed the child around 3:30AM. At approximately 5:00AM, the mother checked on the child and discovered her unresponsive. The mother called 911 and first responders arrived and transported the child to the hospital by ambulance where she was pronounced deceased. An autopsy was performed, and the cause of death was listed as Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) and the manner was natural.

MCDSS interviewed the family and assessed the safety of the home environment. MCDSS conducted interviews and the siblings' safety was assessed throughout the investigation. The father of the 6-year-old sibling expressed concern for his child's care with the mother, which was addressed by MCDSS. The mother has had significant child welfare involvement since the fatality and had an open CPS investigation and Preventive Services case at the time of the SCR report. MCDSS collaborated with community service providers and Preventive Services to assist in meeting the needs of the family and making necessary referrals.

There was sufficient information gathered by way of collateral and casework contacts to unsubstantiate the allegations. The CPS investigation was closed on 8/10/20 and the family remained open with Preventive Services.

LDSS Response

On 6/6/20, MCDSS received the report from the SCR and contacted law enforcement regarding the fatality. They notified the DA's office and gathered additional information from emergency medical services and the medical examiner's office.

MCDSS conducted a home visit, and they interviewed the mother and the 13yo sibling regarding the death. The 13yo sibling reported he was 3-years-old when the death occurred. He remembered hearing crying and yelling the morning of the incident, but was unable to contribute any other information. The 6yo sibling and 4yo twin siblings were not alive at the time of the fatality; however, they were interviewed about overall safety and risk, and did not disclose concerns about their safety while with their mother. MCDSS determined the siblings were safe in their mother's care.

The mother reported that she last saw the subject child alive around 3:30AM on 3/26/10. The mother described the child as being fussy since birth. The night of the death, the child was crying, so the mother gave her a bath and used lotion and essential oils in an attempt to calm her. The mother fed the child a bottle of formula and placed her to sleep in a swing. The mother then fell asleep on a sofa next to the child's sleep space. The mother woke up at approximately 5:00AM and said that she would typically hear the child making baby noises, but did not, which prompted her to check on the child. The mother observed the color in the child's face to be gone. She proceeded to pick up the child from the swing and reported the child felt heavy, which made her believe she had been deceased for a period of time prior to being discovered. The mother called 911 and first responders arrived and transported the child by ambulance to the hospital where she was pronounced deceased.

The grandfather reported that the night of the death the child was given a bath and had fallen asleep on his chest, which was the last time he had seen her. The father of the subject child was interviewed and reported he had lived with the mother and subject child; however, he was in the process of moving out after a fight with the mother. The night leading up to the death, the father went to the mother's residence to collect his belongings. The mother had tried to send the subject child with him; however, there was no room in the vehicle and he was unable take her. The father reported he had heard different accounts of the death, which included the child sleeping in a swing in front of an air conditioner, the child sleeping on the sofa with the mother, the child passing of SIDS and that the child had aspirated. There were attempts made to interview the father of the then 3yo sibling; however, MCDSS was not able to locate and interview him.

Law enforcement reported they had investigated the death in 2010 and closed their case. The medical examiner determined there was no significant antemortem injury noted on the gross or radiographic examinations of the child. The final report listed the child's cause of death as Sudden Infant Death Syndrome and the manner was natural. MCDSS gathered records from the subject child's pediatrician before her death, which contained no reports of concern for her care. The pediatrician for the other children reported no concern for their care.

Foster Care Placement History

On 1/14/07 the now 13yo sibling was removed from the MO and placed in foster care. The MO was substantiated for C/T/S and IG, after she admitted to getting frustrated with the sibling and throwing him. The sibling was placed with the MGM on 1/17/07 and then with the aunt and uncle on 2/8/07. The MO was court ordered to receive preventive services for 1 year including parent education and supervised visitation. The mother successfully completed her services and the case was closed on 9/22/08
